Nina Schooler is Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at State University of New York Downstate Medical Center, New York, NY. Her substantive research focuses on treatment of schizophrenia from its earliest identification to long term course and outcomes. She is also interested in methods for innovative clinical trial designs and development of assessment tools. She is a fellow of the American College of Neuropsychopharmacology, the Collegium Internationale Neuropsychopharmacologicum (CINP), the American Psychological Association, the American Psychological Society and a member of both ASCP and ISCTM. Dr. Schooler has been President of the American Psychopathological Association and the Association for Clinical Psychosocial Research and has served as an elected Councillor of the CINP. She publishes widely in the peer-reviewed psychiatric literature and has served as an editor for volumes relating to psychiatric clinical trials, clinical assessment, and research methods. Prof. Schooler's contributions to the field have been recognized by numerous awards; she was honored to be the first recipient of the Andrew Leon Lifetime Achievement Award from the ISCTM in 2012 and the ASCP Lifetime Achievement Award from ASCP.. She received her PhD in Social Psychology from Columbia University. Her employment history includes the National Institute of Mental Health, Bethesda, Maryland, the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Pittsburgh and the Zucker Hillside Hospital. Her ongoing activities focus on multi-modal treatment approaches to first episode psychosis, teaching and mentoring.
