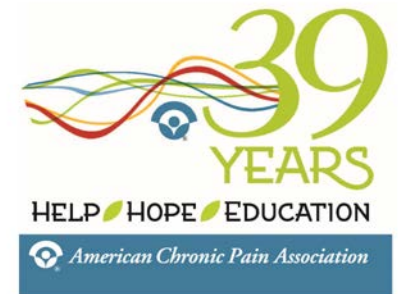


# Patients Entering a Clinical Trial

## **What are some of the issues people face when considering entering a clinical trial?**

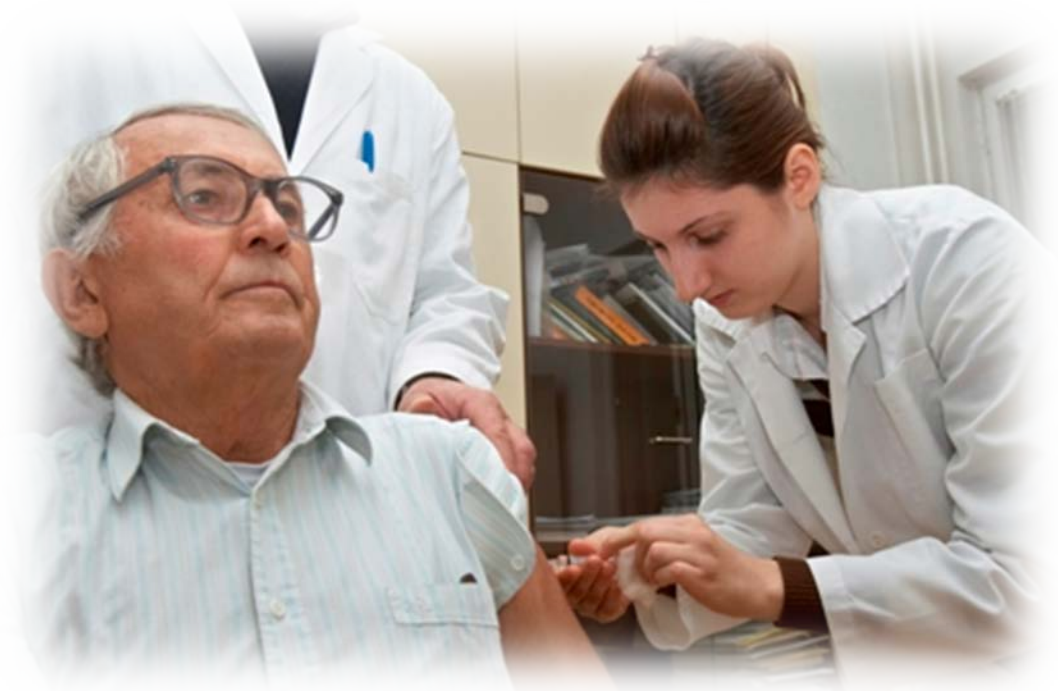
In a survey of 550 people with pain, over 90% said they would like to receive information about clinical trials. However their HCP does not inform them or give them that option.

## Reasons for taking part in clinical trials

- **65%** said yes or were not sure if they would be more likely to be involved if they did not have health insurance
- Less than **25%** wanted to receive payment for being involved
- **95%** who have been in a trial would be willing do it again
- **40%** are very concerned that they might receive a placebo

## Concerns of taking part in clinical trials

- Invasive lab tests before the trials
- Time away from work or home (**56%**)
- Side effects of treatment (**65%**)
- Continue treatment if successful (**74%**)
- Travel time to trial (**52%**)



## Concerns of taking part in clinical trials

- Number of clinical appointments (**53%**)
- Increased pain if current pain medication is discontinued during trial (**73%**)
- Privacy of medical information might be shared especially insurance company (**66%**)
- Receiving trial results after completed (**69%**)
- Receive trial medication after trial if it helped (**61%**)
